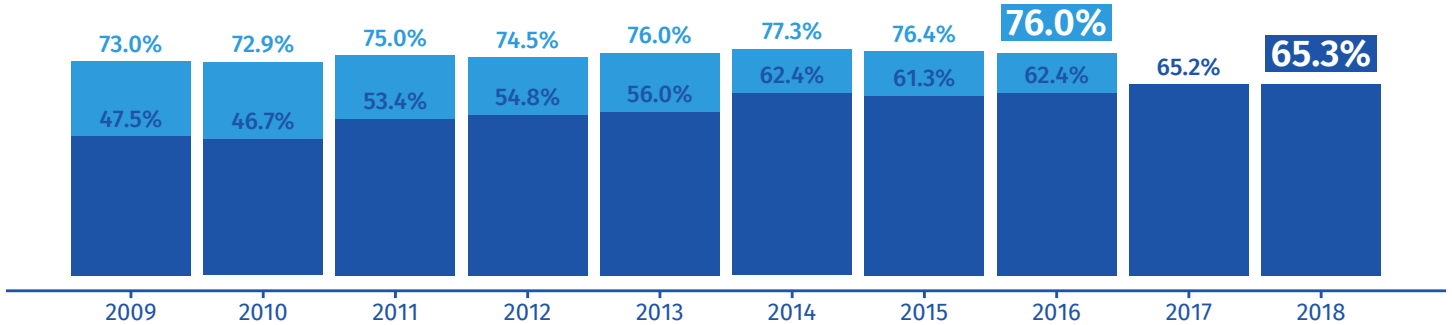
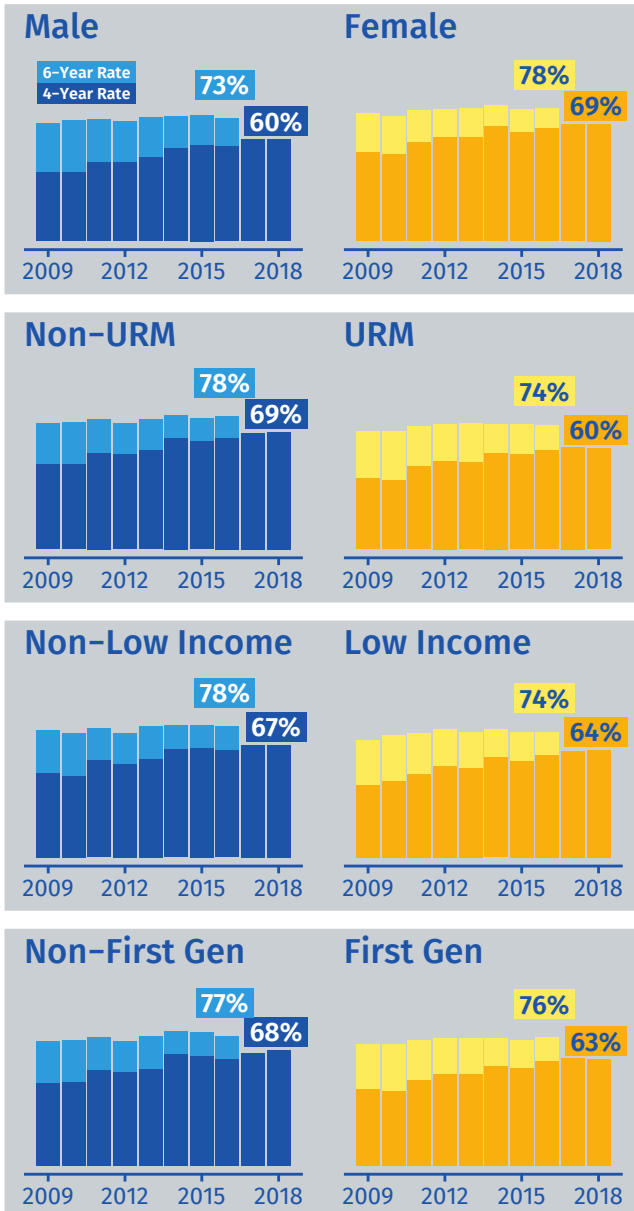


Frosh Graduation Rates, 2009–2018 Cohorts

■ 4-Year Rate



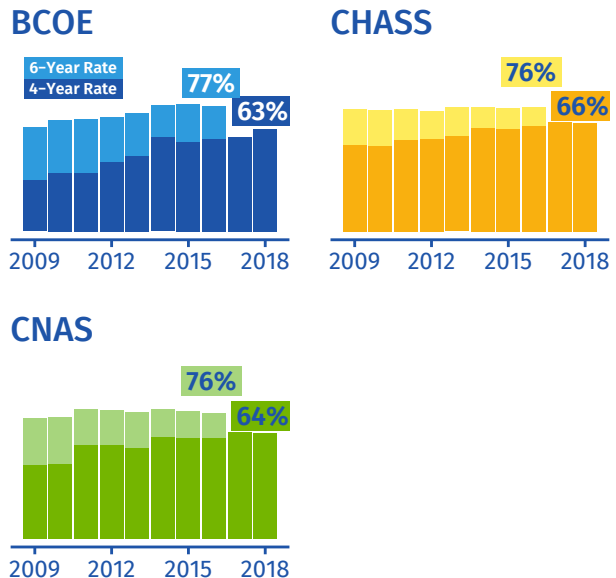
Frosh Grad Rates by Demographics



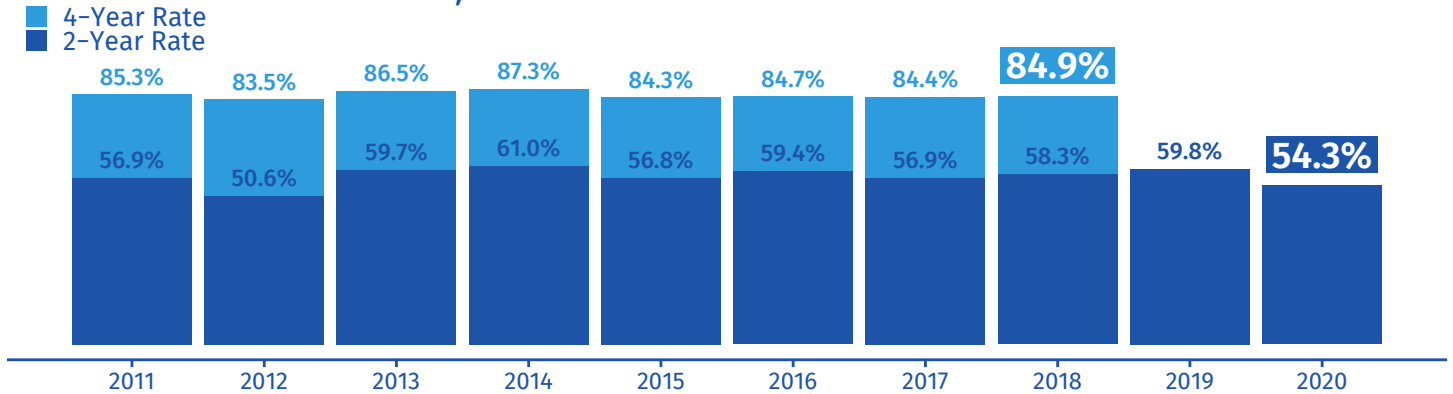
UCR measured another record high on its 4-year graduation rate: 65.3% of first-time, full-time frosh who entered in Fall 2018 graduated within four years, representing a slight increase of 0.1 percentage points over the previous cohort. Rates remained relatively steady among traditionally underrepresented student populations, with small drops in 4-year rates for first-generation students (down 0.9 percentage points from the previous cohort) and underrepresented minority students (down 0.6 points) and a small increase for low-income students (up 0.3 points).

The 6-year graduation rate for frosh declined slightly from the previous year, with 76.0% of Fall 2016 entrants graduating within six years, down by 0.4 percentage points relative to the prior cohort. The rate has remained within a narrow range of 76.0% to 77.3% across the past four successive cohorts. The UC 2030 goal for UCR's frosh 6-year graduation rate is 85%.

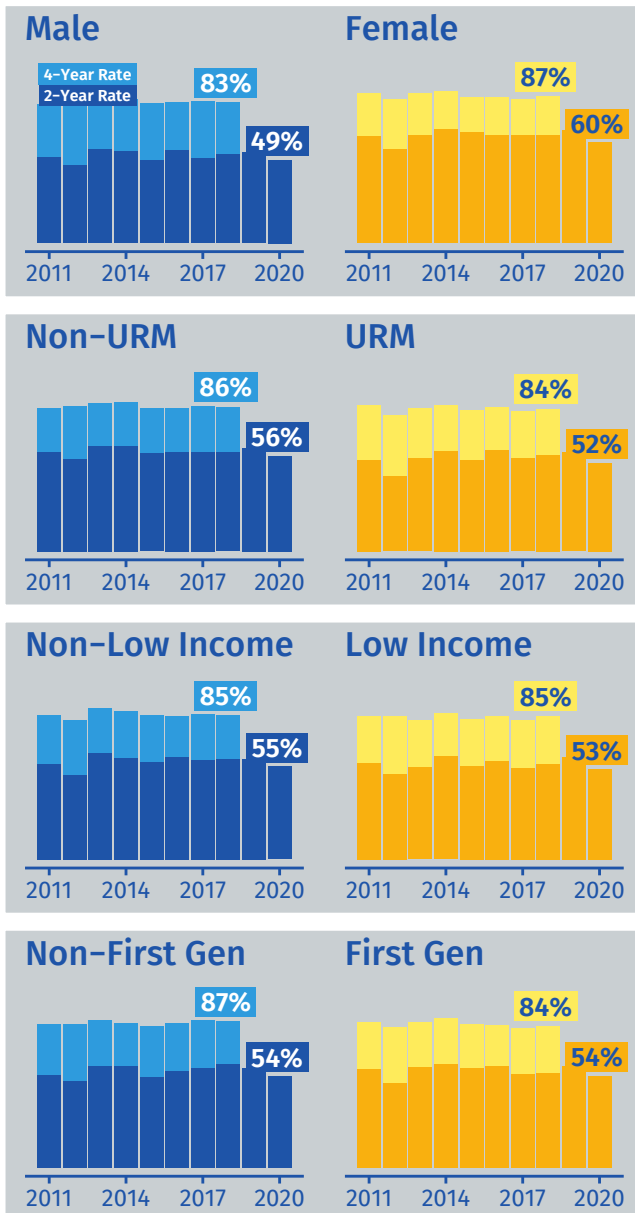
Frosh Grad Rates by Starting College

Undergraduate transfer graduation rates remain below the peak levels achieved by the 2014 entering cohort. Among the most recent cohorts, the 2-year rate of 54.3% for Fall 2020 entrants represented a notable decline of 5.5 percentage points relative to the preceding cohort, but the 4-year rate of 84.9% for the Fall 2018 cohort showed a small increase of 0.5 percentage points from the previous year's rates.

Equity gaps remain relatively small among transfer students, with 2-year rates for low-income and first-generation students within 2 percentage points and 4-year rates within 3 percentage points of their counterparts. Among underrepresented minority transfer students, there was a 4-point gap in the 2-year rate and a 2-point gap in the 4-year rate. The UC 2030 goal for UCR's transfer 4-year graduation rate is 93%.
